Our son started school for the first time this past fall, charging off across the playground into Junior Kindergarten on his first day, literally without looking back. It was a conflicted moment as a parent, with part of me exclaiming proudly, "Oh wow, he never even looked back!!" and part of me grieving, "Oh wow...he never even looked back...."

With both our kids now in school full-time, it's shocking how much life changed. My wife has some free time in the day (free time to do all the other things she needs to do!). Friday, my day off, is actually a very quiet and restful day off! More importantly, our kids are learning, growing, thriving, and making friends. Overall, it's an amazing thing!

There are some harder parts too. We have had the odd encounter with a mean kid at school. The teacher has sometimes had to correct. Today's "best friend" might not be so by the end of the day. Kids say things, and we can't control it, and we're not there to fix it in the moment. The change has not always been easy.

But, in what became Meadow Brook's sort of unofficial motto in our year of transition:

Healthy things grow. Growing things change. Change always challenges.

It is the inevitable by-product of health and growth that things must change. We always want the health and the growth – who doesn't want to be healthy and thriving?! But the change part – that can be more difficult!

And yet, even with the occasional challenges of school, we wouldn't trade the health and the growth of it for anything. We are happy to see our kids getting smarter, wiser, more social, more compassionate – the trade-off is very, very good!

As followers of Jesus, we are never "done" – we are in a constant state of transformation, and are on a constant mission to win the world over to Jesus. Whether we like it or not, we have committed to a life of never-ending newness, as God makes us new, and does new things in us and through us in order to spread His Gospel and advance His Kingdom.
