"But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed." (Luke 5:16)

As I write this, the surest sign of summertime in Leamington has occurred: I have walked outside in the morning and had fish flies smash into my face.

The upsides of this disgusting phenomenon are: I) apparently it means that we have a healthy lake this year (although maybe that's just something that "gets said" so that we tolerate the swarms); and 2) it means that warmth and humidity and summer are officially here! We can put up with a few days of disgusting fly carcasses if it means that summer's glory is upon us!

We pray for a summer that is safe, fun, and meaningful for us and our friends and families. Hopefully it means that there will be at least *some* down-time, with vacations or weekends off breaking up the work and the busyness of life. Hopefully we have some time to "get away from it all," even if we are staying home, where the pace of life can shift for a little while, and where we can find some rest and refreshing with our loved ones.

As the verse above suggests, Jesus apparently felt this need as much as anyone. He often pulled away from normal life, and backed off from his responsibilities and the pressures of work, at least for a little while. He got away from the crowds, got away from his disciples, and found quiet places where he could reconnect with his Heavenly Father, no doubt refreshing his soul and preparing him for whatever was next. (Sidebar: because of passages like this, psychologists have theorized that Jesus was almost certainly an introvert. Shout out to the quiet ones!])

Scripture calls us to work, to work hard, and to do so joyfully (Pr 12:11; Pr 14:23; Col 3:23; 2Th 3:10, etc.). This is right and good, and not only provides for our needs but also honours the Lord. Yet at the same time, Scripture also puts a lot of weight upon the principle of rest, the intentional and regular shifting of priorities, the pulling away from the day-to-day, and the refreshing of the body, mind, and soul that occurs when we do so (Gen 2:2-3; Ex 23:12; Mk 6:31; Heb 4:9-11, etc.).

Hard work and true rest are two sides of a coin; both are commanded, and both are necessary. To neglect either one is to dishonor the Lord and disregard His Scriptures; to walk in both is to find fulfillment as the people of God.

If Jesus needed time to pull away from life and refresh Himself, then we should embrace the practice too! As His followers, we are not greater, busier, more important, or more indispensable than He, and so we can gratefully follow His example, ensuring that we take time to draw away from the day-to-day and find some refreshing.

This summer, please ensure that you are taking some time to do just that! Enjoy the change of pace, enjoy the time with loved ones, and enjoy connecting with God in a different way. May your summer be filled with laughter, health, rest and refreshing, and may God draw near you in a special way as you enjoy these summer months!
