### Missions Update from D and M

A few weeks ago D and M and their children had the opportunity to go to Lisbon, Portugal for MB Mission's EURAC conference (European Retreat & Consultation). This conference takes place every 3 years and is such a special time for all long term"workers" as a chance to reconnect with those serving among the least reached. D shared that one of the highlights for them was simply being in a room full of incredible people, whose hearts are devoted to the nations, and worshiping together. The theme for the conference was taken from Acts 6:7- "So the word of God spread; the numbers of disciples in Jerusalem INCREASED RAPIDLY...." D also wrote that a number of sessions focused on how they can multiply the gospel of Jesus as a body of believers. Something that became a personal challenge for D himself was the fact that true multiplication can only come as we die to ourselves and experience suffering. Possibly we, here at Meadow Brook, should ask ourselves the same question that D asked himself: "I reflected on whether I continually "die to myself" so that God can multiply Jesus through my life. What do I need to surrender daily?"

During the last days of EURAC, a number of National Catalysts (Apostles) who are working throughout Central Asia/ Europe joined the missionaries in worship and training. Together with these National Leaders they are seeing MULTIPLICATION happen; together they strive to embrace diversity for the sake of spreading God's word. Dave invites us to keep praying for the gospel to spread rapidly and MULTIPLY as they move forward. A great program was organized for the kids where they were able to talk together with other MKs about what it means to live in a country different than their "passport" country. They were also coached on how to have daily personal Bible time and how this interaction with Jesus can be so dynamic.

Our ongoing prayers are needed for the following items:

- For the National Leaders who serve selflessly in their homelands often encountering persecution and ridicule
- For the new fellowship that has formed in Linz, that people would be drawn to faith in Jesus.
- For their T.ksh sister as she learns how to be a believer in a difficult environment.
- For the growing fellowship in Ist.bl and strength and endurance for the local believers there, as well as women to work with other women alongside H'kan.

Let's be faithful in praying for this family as they are working on the "front lines"!
